Renoir and the Queanbeyan Museum?

An unlikely association, you might think, but there is a connection.

I recently read a fascinating article which highlights the effect of light on pigments. Conservators and analytical chemists, using a technique called Raman Spectroscopy, examined a pigment in an 1883 painting by Renoir, 'Madame Leon Clapisson'. The painting has a background that appears to be dark grey. The spectroscopic analysis identified the original pigment and revealed that the background and the pigment were originally much more red than grey. The pigment had faded from its original colour of red, to grey, probably due to exposure to light. If you are interested in the details of the analysis that led to this discovery you can read the article or you can appreciate the difference just by looking at the current painting and the recolourised image. What has this to do with Queanbeyan Museum? Quite a bit, actually. Perhaps we don't have many paintings, much less by Renoir (that we know of) but we do have other objects that are susceptible to light fading. Our photographs, especially colour photos, postcards, painted objects and textiles, all have pigments and dyes that may fade from exposure to light. In our museum, to prevent light fading, we store our collection away from light, in a dark room. When objects are on display, we aim to control the amount of light on our objects and thus minimise fading.
