National Archaeology Week 2014 - Friends of Archaeology

On Sunday 18 May 2014 Deputy Mayor Cr Peter Bray opened National Archaeology Week at the Museum. He entertained about 50 people with his personal exploits into this field, delving into other people's rubbish, as could be said of much archaeology. Helen Cooke, President of the Canberra Archaeological Society spoke of some people's amazement at local archaeology followed by a hands on look at some of the artefacts on show that had been retrieved in local digs such as Crinigans at Gungahlin. These artefacts help to tell stories of the early settlers, particularly the women who are often missing from the historical record. The Crinigan artefacts have recently been provisionally registered as ACT Heritage Objects.

Dr Rebecca Parkes was on hand to discuss the artefacts from Googong that have been donated to the Museum. Patrick Connolly's 1860 home site was excavated before the Googong Development began and the back to back fireplaces have been re erected in the new township to show that pioneers were part of the 1800s landscape. Later this year we will have an Exhibition on Googong and the families associated with the early settlement of the area.

Ximena Briceno and Marilyn Folger had prepared display photos of the Crinigans project which had involved many hours of excavation, sieving and washing of artefacts by family, friends and CAS members, also photos of the QDHMS visit to the Googong dig in March 2012.

Our courtyard served the purpose well together with the sunshine, chat, tea and coffee and Anne's homemade fudge slice.

National Archaeology Week continued with events such as *Hidden histories: lost in the mud at Fromelles* at the Australian War Memorial, *Archaeology family fun day* at Questacon and a *Visit to archaeology sites in Gungahlin* (Crinigans, The Valley, Palmer Trig and Girrawah Park).

Rusten House – In the News

Where to now for this historic Queanbeyan building? Put aside a small space for historical medical memorabilia? A writer's retreat? A gallery? Accommodation for an Artist in Residence? A Brief Overview of its History:

- ♦ 1861 permanent Hospital building constructed now known as Rusten House
- ♦ End section built as Isolation Ward
- ♦ 1933 became Matrons Flat when 'new' Hospital (central core) was constructed
- ♦ 1970s Blood Bank, in end section fronting Collett Street, closed 1987
- ♦ Late 1980s office area for senior nursing personnel (Accreditation HQ) with middle section for Mental Health team
- ♦ Flats for Trainee Enrolled nurses accommodation when the Nurses Home closed
- ♦ Accommodation for building team from Goulburn (South East Health HQ) during the nine months of refurbishment of Hospital
- ♦ Occupied by expanded Mental Health Services and Living Skills programme
- ♦ 1991-2 Historical Restoration now referred to as 'Rusten House' rather than 'The Old Hospital'
- ♦ "Rustys Coffee Shop" a Living Skills initiative opened 1993, (in Blood Bank section), closed 1997
- ♦ 1997 building refurbished for Community Health Services e.g. Palliative Care and Community Nurses, Children's Services
- ♦ 2014 Hand over by NSW Health Department to Queanbeyan City Council
- ♦ Currently renovations are being under taken by QCC to bring it to a level aiming for opening Rusten House for inspection by stakeholders with a view to submission of plans for the future usage of this historic building.

I have been working in partnership with volunteer, Heather Thomson, every Wednesday, accessioning and cataloguing artefacts from the collection. We have focused on objects from the Laundry room, Main Street Gallery and Hospital room. One of the most interesting objects is a wooden clothes' mangle crafted in the 19th century in the United States. This object found its way from the United States to Queanbeyan. This object was manufactured on a commercial scale, and represents the power of supply and demand for domestic products before electricity. It is also a remainder of how labour intensive domestic chores were performed, mostly by children and women.
