Marion Meische from Gundaroo has been researching for the Gundaroo town and school for their 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations held in March 2015. Gunning Shire Patriotic and Welfare Fund Gundaroo June 5th 1940

My Committee have directed me to thank you for your carrying of parcels (free)... in connection with our Patriotic War Effort... we were able to raise over 60 pounds..

Yours truly (signed) WJ Dunn Hon Secretary

Mr Joseph Dunn was Headmaster of Gundaroo School for the years 1933 – 1940.
